A Month in the Life of the Community and Global Discipleship Commission: Phyllis's Perspective

As I woke up this morning, I found myself wondering if today might be a rare day without responsibilities. The thought was fleeting, overshadowed by the busy calendar of events and meetings ahead. As co-chair of the Community and Global Discipleship Commission, my days are often filled with both purpose and activity, all revolving around serving others.

This month has been particularly packed. We began with two dedicated days spent in the church nursery assembling and filling food bags for the ECEAP children. It's always heartwarming to know these bags will brighten the days of those in need. Every second and fourth Friday, we visit the food bank, gathering items not only for ECEAP but also for New Hope. Each trip is a reminder of the community we're building—each can of soup or box of cereal represents our collective effort to support our neighbors. Twice Monthly on Tuesdays, we prepare and serve hot lunches for 45 to 60 guests at New Hope. It's rewarding work. Just last Tuesday, Jan took the lead in the kitchen, and we made a delightful meal that brought smiles to so many faces. I love these moments, where our efforts translate directly into nourishment and fellowship. Our commission meetings take place via Zoom on the second Tuesday of each month. This is where we gather as a team to share ideas, plan future activities, and discuss how we can continue to serve effectively. The energy during these meetings is always uplifting, reminding me why I joined this commission in the first place.

This week promises to be just as full. Tuesday the 24th, we'll meet in the church kitchen at 10:30 am to prepare lunch for New Hope. It's a team effort—everyone pitches in, and I love seeing how we all come together for a common cause. On Thursday the 26th, we'll head out for shopping—Pat will create a list of items needed for the ECEAP kids. It's a little adventure, navigating the aisles of Costco and Winco, making sure we gather everything required. Friday is another important day. We'll check in at the food bank for ECEAP and for our Bags of Grace initiative. Each visit feels significant, a small but vital piece in a larger puzzle of support and community care. This Saturday the 28th is particularly special; we're setting up for Pastor Sue's retirement party in the Fellowship Hall. It's a celebration of service and dedication, a chance to honor our Shepherd of 20+ who has given so much to our community.

The week following is just as busy, with bagging events for the ECEAP kids on Thursday and Friday, and then preparations for our "Faith in Action" day and weekend. The highlight of the Faith in Action weekend will be on Sunday which is focused on filling the Bags of Grace. Our goal for this year's Faith in Action is 500 bags of Grace. Each of the 5 churches celebrating this effort with us will receive 100 Bags to share with the homeless folks in our area. We've reserved the Fellowship Hall until about 3 pm to ensure we have ample time to finish and clean up. The work will be long but rewarding. It's what we do; it's who we are. As the sun sets on our busy Sunday, we'll gather again for dinner and worship, wrapping up a fulfilling week of service and community. It's a life filled with purpose, each day presenting its own challenges and joys. As I reflect on all we've accomplished and what's still ahead, I realize there may not be a day without responsibilities anytime soon, but that's okay. It's in this work that I find my passion and purpose, alongside a dedicated group of like-minded individuals.

Good Faith Bookkeeping, Cherie, is doing an excellent job taking care of our accounting needs.


Pastor Preston Woodall's home and hospital visitation work continues. Thank you for this important ministry to FPC. Congratulations on your recent ordination!
