But maybe reaching out to people can be one of our best ways to shine a light.

Let's not hide our light. May it shine.

Personnel, Stewardship, and Finance Committee

It is October and our Stewardship Campaign is in full swing. Watch our bulletin board for the 4 week theme of OUR SEASON OF CHANGE. We will be considering what to keep, toss, recycle and renew in our ministry here in Puyallup. The scripture focuses are Matthew 6:31–32, Luke 12:18–21, Jeremiah 18:1–6, and Hebrews 13:5. As Pastor Tom Paine says, "May this season remind us all of God's constant faithfulness, and may our stewardship reflect our trust in the One who makes all things new."

Our expected income for this time of year is 67%. At this time we have received 61% income and our expenses are currently 57%. Please continue to keep your giving current as year end approaches.



Project Regeneration

It is time for an update on Regeneration and the accomplishments over the past year. The Regeneration Committee and the Session began working on this project in September 2023. It all began by reading the book, The Sailboat Church by Joan S. Gray and deciding what would be the future of Puyallup First Presbyterian Church. From November 2023-March 2024, there was much research, study, discussion and evaluation about the future of FPC. It was decided to continue our presence in downtown Puyallup, by Reinvention of Ministry. Members and friends were asked to join the brainstorming of new ministry possibilities in June of 2024. From the meeting, over 100 ministry ideas were generated and the regeneration committee studied and ranked the new ministry ideas for implementation. The top seven new ideas were: 1) A ministry involving young adults in how we worship, outings, and outreach, 2) advocate more on homelessness, hunger and medical care issues, 3) outreach to our seniors, 4) tutoring for Meeker Elementary School, 5) helping young people who have aged out of foster care, 6) seeking more outreach opportunities for seniors in the community, and 7) an after school place for students to gather for fellowship. These ideas were then assigned to the appropriate committee on the session or deacons to explore and implement. Through this committee work, new ministries have been set in place. There is now a Food Pantry, a community potluck was held, a phone tree has developed for those living alone, Eileen and Callie's place has been adopted to help those aging out of foster care, and opportunities to support the police and fire departments are being explored. Much has been accomplished during the last year. How can you join others in these important ministries?

Faith In Action

We will be doing service projects for the people in our community, and beyond.

There are five churches participating this year: First Presbyterian, Shepherd of the Hill, Peace Lutheran, Immanuel Lutheran and United Methodist church.

Some of the activities being planned are cleaning up parking lots of area non-profit organizations, putting together furniture, making personal care kits, and making Bags of Grace.

On Sunday, October 5, remember that we at First Presbyterian will not have a worship service. Instead, we invite you to join us at 10:30 am here, to put together the small item and first aid bags. These will be included in the larger bags, that we will put together at 1:00 pm. Our goal is a total of 250 Bags, 50 for each of the participating churches.
