Our church family here at FPC and Bates College Early Childhood Education Assistance Program (ECEAP) has a long tradition and partnership. Preschoolers in this program are ages 3-5 and at risk for any of a variety of reasons, medical, financial, foster care, ELL (English Language Learners), etc. This time of year is magical and exciting for most families. Some families have a support system and get through the season well. Other families can provide abundant love but struggle to provide extra items beyond basic needs.

The Deacons have requested information for 15 children in the preschool as well as siblings so that all children in a family get 3 gifts - an item of clothing, a toy and a book. This year the Giving Tree will be up for 3 Sundays in November: the 16th, 23rd and 30th. We will have tags on the tree starting Sunday November 16th. The tag will have the first name of the child, the gender of the child, the child's age and information for selecting a gift like, size and favorite color for clothing, or hints like "loves Paw Patrol" or "super heroes or princesses!!!" You will take the tag, shop for the item, and return the unwrapped item with the tag by Sunday December 7th. The Deacons will wrap the items and box all gifts by family group for the Preschool Administrator to deliver to the family.

This is happening in November this year as the Deacons will have to wrap all the presents by Tuesday December 9th . We are a generous congregation and I'm sure we can do this as we always have!!! Thanks in advance for making this a magical time of year for all our children!!!

 - * Wet wipes (2 packets) Packet of tissues
 - * 8 10 band-aids Toothpaste and toothbrush
 - * Lip balm

Also, consider donating items to the Free Food Pantry. That is another place for those in need to find food.


Weekend Snack Bag Assembly
